Dear Potential English 4/ Rhetoric 101-102 Students and Parents/Guardians:

Through a partnership with Joliet Junior College (JJC), Joliet Township High School students have an opportunity to take Rhetoric 101-102 while still in high school and upon successful completion of these courses, earn both college and high school credit. Students wishing to enroll in these dual credit classes must:

- Successfully complete English 3.
- Complete the application for admission to Joliet Junior College.
- Meet JJC requirements for admission by taking the ACCUPLACER placement test and achieving a qualifying score on the reading and writing placement exams. Students may also qualify for the course based on SAT scores.
- Contact the college or university they plan to attend regarding approval of transfer credit.
- Check NCAA eligibility status (if applicable).

The following is general information about the dual credit opportunity for Joliet Township High School students:

- Rhetoric 101-102 will be taught at Joliet West and Joliet Central.
- Students are required to pay a reduced tuition for the course, though this tuition is waived for students qualifying for free and reduced lunch.
- Joliet Township High School will supply textbooks.
- Upon successful completion, students will receive three hours of college credit for Rhetoric 101; Rhetoric 102, the second semester, is also worth three hours; successful completion of both semesters also fulfills Joliet Township High School graduation requirements for English credits.
- Students who have earned a "D" or an "F" in any JJC class prior to this point in time may **NOT** register for the dual credit Rhetoric class. Students who successfully pass Rhetoric 101 but receive a "D" or an "F" in any other JJC course taken concurrently with the Rhetoric class **will not** be allowed to register for Rhetoric 102.
- Students successfully completing Rhetoric 101-102 at Joliet Township High School will have a JJC transcript on file at the college indicating their grades and credits awarded.
