Dear Potential Chemistry 101-102 Student and Parents/Guardians:

Through a partnership with Joliet Junior College (JJC), Joliet Township High School students have an opportunity to take Chemistry 101-102 while still in high school and upon successful completion of these courses, earn both college and high school credit simultaneously. Students wishing to enroll in these dual credit classes must:

- ✓ Successfully complete three years of high school science, including chemistry.
- ✓ Successfully complete two semesters of geometry, with a grade of C or higher.
- ✓ Complete the Academic Dual Credit Student Electronic Approval Form
- ✓ Complete the Joliet Junior College Dual Credit Application (found on JJC website).
- ✓ Meet JJC requirements for admission and achieving the *minimum* scores for placement in English 101 and Math 139 (found on JJC website).
- ✓ Contact the college or university they plan to attend regarding approval of transfer credit.
- ✓ Check NCAA eligibility status if applicable.

The following is general information about the dual credit opportunity for Joliet Township High School students:

- Chemistry 101-102 is traditionally taught on campus at JJC on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 1:00 p.m. until 3:00 p.m. with a fee of approximately \$900 per semester course (\$1800 total).
- Tuition and fees will be the responsibility of the student and parents/guardians.
- Costs of textbooks and other required materials will be the responsibility of the student and parents/guardians.
- Transportation to and from JJC will be the responsibility of the student and parents/guardians.
- Students will be released from the high school campus at 12:20 p.m. eachday.
- JJC courses are semester courses, students will receive five college credit hours for Chemistry 101 in the fall and five college credit hours for Chemistry 102 in the spring. Upon successful completion of these two semesters, students will have earned ten hours of college credit and will have earned 2 hours of high school science credit.
- Students who have earned a "D" or an "F" in any JJC class prior to this point in time may NOT register for another dual credit course. Students who successfully pass Chemistry 101 but receive a "D" or an "F" in any other JJC course taken concurrently with the Chemistry 101 class will not be allowed to register for Chemistry 102.
- Students successfully completing Chemistry 101-102 will have a JJC transcript on file at the college indicating their grades and credits awarded.
